

MARG's gesture to flood victims of Kurnool, Andra Pradesh

Kurnool, a city with a population of nearly five lakh, bore the brunt of the flood fury as water reached the first storey of several buildings. The unprecedented flood on 2nd October 2009 from Tungabhadra river made people leave everything behind to escape to elevated areas. Thousands have lost all their household belongings such as food grains, cloths, house hold articles etc. This is said to be the worst ever flood that Kurnool has witness in the last 100 years.

Months after the flood, with people's normal life getting restored through relief and rehabilitation measures from different agencies. On 6th March MARG as part of its corporate social responsibility has distributed kerosene pump stoves to 3000 flood affected families of Budhawarpet and Joharapuram wards of Karnool. Venkatesh MLA, Kurnool to distribute stoves and clothes to 3000 flood affected victims.
